Flagger Novice Course

SCNSC's Flagger Training Course is a comprehensive skill-building session that meets both federal and local state guidelines. The foundation of the curriculum is based on the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) as well as state-specific requirements from South Carolina, Georgia and North Carolina Departments of Transportation. This certification is approved for flagging in these three Southeastern states.

OSHA 511 | Standards for General Industry

This course covers OSHA policies, procedures, and standards, as well as General Industry safety and health principles. A copy of the 29 CFR 1910 General Industry Standards is included with the registration fee. Participants must successfully pass a written exam at the end of the course.

For those interested in becoming authorized to teach 10hr and 30hr OSHA Outreach classes, the OSHA #511 course meets one of two prerequisites for the OSHA #501 Trainer Course for General Industry. Please note, the 30-hour General Industry OSHA outreach class is not considered equivalent to OSHA #511.


